

## Is Your Library in Need of a Cleanup?

All Electrical Designer Users

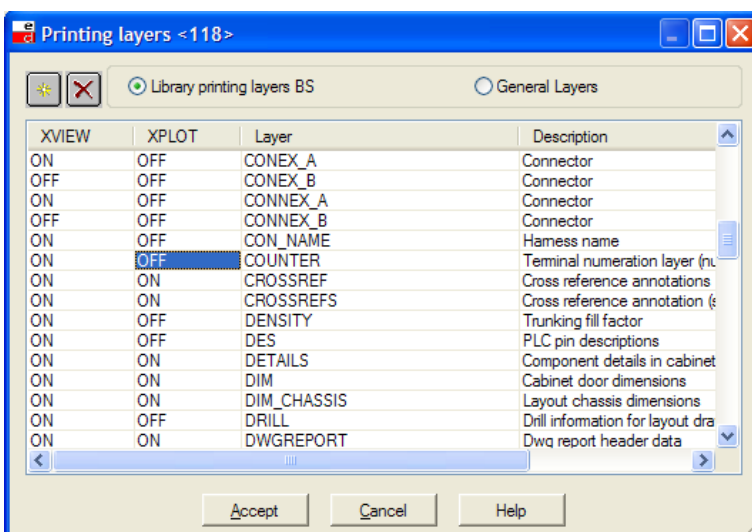
After many years of use and several users later, a customer library can end up untidy with unwanted blocks, duplicated blocks and blocks that were not completed at the time.

A simple way to analyse the library for these types of issues is to run a Library Show. This will create several index pages to review. These index pages are also useful to new shop floor personnel so that they understand the graphical symbols used in your schematics.

Select the library you wish to review from the Libraries browser e.g. BS

Select  *Printing Layers*

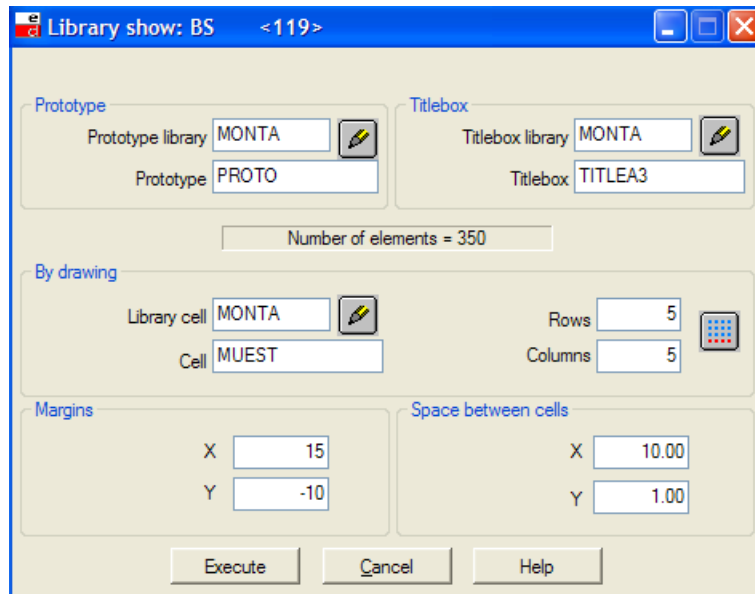
Ensure that the layers you wish to be turned off in the symbols are selected as shown e.g. COUNTER



Select *Accept*

Select the *Elements Browser*

Select the  *Library Show*



Alter the values of the margins according to your title border.

Select *Execute*.

The command will then create multiple “\$” drawings which will be at the top of the element list each with 25 symbols inserted with a description.

You can then print these drawings off. This then enables you to analyse which symbols are no longer required and to delete if necessary.
